WHAT'S HAPPENING AROUND TOWN

Construction has begun on the Jungle Shores Waterline Extension Project. We are installing approximately one (1) mile of water line and eleven (11) hydrants. We ask for your patience while this project is constructed.

The long awaited sidewalk project on the landward side of Palmetto Boulevard has begun. The sidewalks being repaired are between Baynard and Atlantic. This project is being funded by a \$400,000 Department of Transportation Grant and \$321,165 in Colleton Transportation Commission Funds. EDISTO RECIPES

Chocolate Dipped Heart-shaped Cookies



1 egg
1 cup crunchy peanut butter
1 cup sugar
12 ounce pkg milk chocolate chips

Preheat oven to 350°. Line baking sheet with parchment paper. Combine egg, peanut butter and sugar in bowl. Place dough between two sheets of wax paper and roll to ½ inch thickness. Cut the dough with a heart-shaped cookie cutter. Place on prepared baking sheet and bake until the edges are golden (appx. 7-10 min). Cool completely on the baking sheet.

Melt the chocolate chips in the microwave at 30 second intervals until fully melted, stirring between intervals. Dip the bottom and sides of each cookie in the melted chocolate. Place cookies on wax paper to dry.

MINUTES December 10, 2015 REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING 6:00 P.M.

Present: Jane S. Darby, Mayor, Susan Hornsby, Mayor Pro Tempore, Jerome Kizer, Crawford Moore and Patti Smyer, Council Members; *Quorum of Council Present.*

Mayor Darby called the meeting to order, followed by the prayer and Pledge of Allegiance led by Mayor Pro Tem Hornsby.

Approval of Minutes

Mayor Pro Tem Hornsby moved to approve the minutes of the regular Council meeting on November 12, 2015. Councilman Moore seconded the motion, which was approved unanimously.

Proclamations and Presentation

Mayor Darby informed those in attendance that Ron Rickenbaker gave a presentation at the worksession earlier in the week. The Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse is conducting a survey, copies of which are available at Town Hall. Mayor Darby asked those in attendance to pick up a copy, fill it out and leave it with the Clerk and Mr. Rickenbaker will pick them up.

Old Business

Councilwoman Smyer moved to approve the second reading of Ordinance 2015-26 to Amend Section 18-53(m) to Extend the Expiration Date for the Regulations Governing Mobile Vending. Councilman Moore seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved.

New Business

A. 2016 Meetings and Holidays schedule - Mayor Pro Tem Hornsby moved to approve the meetings and holidays schedule of 2016. Councilman Moore seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved.

B. Town of Edisto Beach Water System Improvements - On November 20, 2015 the Wharton Smith team met with the Water and Sewer Committee to review possible alternatives to the water system improvements. The Water and Sewer Committee recommends a combination of alternative 4C and 5B at a cost of 7.2 million dollars. Mayor Darby suggested Council take time to look through all the information and revisit the issue in January. Councilman Moore moved to accept the information and to revisit the issue at the January Council meeting, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Hornsby. The motion passed unanimously.

Committee Vacancies

A. TIDE Committee - Councilwoman Smyer moved to approve the advertising of two vacancies on the TIDE Committee. Councilman Kizer seconded the motion, which was passed unanimously.
