MESSAGE FROM OUR MAYOR

As the Mayor of the Town of Edisto Beach, I am proud of the dedication and commitment of our Town Council, Administrator, department heads, staff, committee members, and the entire community. This Annual Report will feature our 2024 accomplishments.

In November 2023, Councilmembers Jerome Kizer and Joey Bagwell were re-elected, and I was re-elected as Mayor. Along with Councilmembers Bob Renner and Jay Watts, we continue to work very hard to protect our beach, serve our residents, and provide needed services.

We are working diligently on accomplishing the tasks involved with the Project Partnership Agreement the Town signed with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers in February 2023, which provides a much-needed \$30 million renourishment for our beach. This project is critical to protecting private property and our pristine public beach. Construction is expected to begin in Winter 2025, with completion slated for May 2026.

We are also very excited about another large project, the \$10 million new Emergency Operations Center/Town Hall complex, which is funded by the Colleton County Penny Sales Tax. This complex will provide much-needed space for our emergency needs and for office and conference space. We anticipate the groundbreaking for this project to be in early Spring 2025.

The Town is financially stable, which enables us to continue to place funds into beach renourishment and infrastructure needs.

We strive to make Edisto Beach a great vacation place for our many visitors but, most importantly, we want Edisto Beach to be a great local community and a wonderful place to live for our residents. Our focus always is to do what's in the best interests of our residents and of our precious beach environment.

Working together, we will continue to make our beautiful beach town the absolute best it can be.

As Town Council annually sets their goals and the budget, we work to carry out the administrative and operational tasks necessary to achieve these goals.

MAJOR TOWN PROJECTS

As noted in the following pages, the Town has a number of projects – both completed and ongoing – we have been working on, but there are three major projects that we've been focusing on which will preserve our beach and improve our infrastructure: the Edisto Beach Coastal Storm Risk Management Project with the US Army Corps of Engineers; the Emergency Operations Center/Town Hall Project; and the Wastewater Improvement Project. These projects are explained in more detail below.



Edisto Beach Coastal Storm Risk Management Project with the US Army Corps of Engineers

We continue our work with the US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) on this important project, which will reduce the risk of damage to life and structures landward of the dunes. Sharing the cost of beach nourishment with the federal government, eligibility for 100% federally funded repairs after declared disasters, and an attractive and usable beach are added benefits of this project. The total construction cost is \$31 million, with the federal cost at \$20 million and the Town cost of \$10 million. The Town has received \$7.5 million from the South Carolina Parks, Recreation, and Tourism Department for this project, and the Town will receive approximately \$5 million in-kind credit for previous work completed. We are on target to begin construction in Winter 2025/Early Spring 2026, with project completion by May 2026. The easement and construction line map has been established, and easements will be discussed with beachfront owners in the near future.

Wastewater Improvement Project

In 2023, the Town received \$8,904,385 in funds through the South Carolina Infrastructure Investment Program and \$500,000 from the Rural Infrastructure Authority to be used toward wastewater system upgrades within the Town. In April 2021, the Town imposed a moratorium on connecting to the sewer system due to the over-extension of the distribution system. Capacity issues at the collection facilities, and much needed updating is now being addressed. American Engineering Consultants, Inc., developed the scope of work needed to address these issues and the project budget. The total cost of all recommended improvements was requested and awarded in grant funding.

Also, upgrades to Pump Stations A & B were also undertaken during the 2023-2024 fiscal year, with larger pumps to be installed, along with new variable frequency drives and controls at both pump stations. Pump Station B construction was completed in June 2023, and the pump is fully operational. Pump Station A construction was completed in September 2024.

As a reminder, these improvements will not expand the Town's sewer system. Instead, they will improve the existing infrastructure to properly accommodate the existing and allocated capacity. Because of this, it is critical that homeowners who are not connected to the sewer system ensure their septic tanks are being properly maintained.

MAJOR TOWN PROJECTS CONTINUED

New Emergency Operations Center/Town Hall

This \$10 million project, which is being paid from the Colleton County Capital Project Sales Tax, is scheduled to begin construction in early 2025, with a 12 to 14-month construction period. Over the past year, we have been working with the architect on the facility's design and working to obtain the required permits. One of the facility's major functions includes an Emergency Operations Center (EOC) which will house emergency personnel and Town

staff before, during, and after emergency events. This plan will allow for a quicker, more efficient response and recovery for the Town. The new Town Hall is designed with extra space for Council Chambers, and more privacy areas for residents to discuss their needs with Town Hall staff. Once the new facility is built, the Police Department will move into the current Town Hall building, and the Fire Department will extend its space into the current Police Department area.

ADDITIONAL TOWN PROJECTS

As with our three major projects, the Town has worked diligently on several other projects in order to improve infrastructure and enhance amenities for our residents and visitors. In 2023-2024, we worked on several major projects including:

Jungle Road Park Bathroom & Trailhead Project

As a convenience for our locals and visitors, construction began on this facility in Spring 2024 and is near completion. Restroom facilities, water stations for humans and pets, a bike repair area, and a Town-wide trail map kiosk are featured. This project was funded through a South Carolina Parks, Recreation, and Tourism Grant. Once the Town's sewer moratorium is lifted, the facility will open for use.

Tennis & Pickleball Resurfacing and Restriping

With funding in the amount of \$25,000 recommended by the ATAX Board, and approved by Town Council, the tennis and pickleball resurfacing and restriping project was completed in December 2023. The pickleball courts have certainly been popular with residents and visitors alike. Town Hall has two pickleball sets available free of charge on a first-come, first-served basis.

Jenkins Street Repaying

Jenkins Street from Palmetto Boulevard to Myrtle Street was repaved with funds from the Capital Improvement Projects Fund. Jenkins Street from Myrtle Street to the Ocean Ridge gated entrance was repaved the year prior.

Arc/Billow Drainage Improvements

In 2021, Town Council approved to move forward with engineered drainage improvements, and funds were requested and received from the American Rescue Plan Act. In December 2022, Town Council approved the bid for this work in the amount of \$266,391 and \$38,185 for design, for a total of \$304,576. Work commenced in Spring 2023, and the project was completed in January 2024.

Interior Lagoon Study

Town Council commissioned Davis & Floyd to conduct an Interior Lagoon Study in order to identify potential solutions for addressing both rainfall and tidal flooding. Davis & Floyd began their work in Fall 2023. In January 2024, an update was shared with Town Council and the public, and a follow-up informational session will be scheduled later this year with residents. This study is funded by the Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) grant.

Bay Creek Park Dock Repairs

Seeing the need for repairs to the Bay Creek Park Dock, Town Council approved this project in 2023. The Town applied for and received \$253,799 in funding through the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources. The total project cost is \$270,949.50. A popular spot for many, the repairs are expected to be finalized in late Fall 2024.

Two Bike Path Improvement Grant Submissions

Two bike path improvement projects were submitted to granting agencies. A grant proposal was submitted to South Carolina DOT Transportation Alternatives Set-Aside Program (TAP) for Lybrand Street, Docksite Road, Yacht Club Road, Edisto Street, and Lee Street Bike Paths in the amount of \$900,000 and approved by SC DOT. Also, a grant proposal for repairs and resurfacing to the Jungle Shores Bike Path was submitted to the Land and Water Conservation Fund in the amount of \$290,000, and this project was approved by the National Park Service.

Ordinance 2024-01 to Amend Section 58-161 of Article VI - Noise

Following input from residents, Town Council approved to amend Section 58-161 of the Town's Code of Ordinances to permit outdoor entertainment between the first day of March and the thirty-first day of October each year, which extended the previous period for outdoor entertainment.

Digital Budget Book

The Town is proud to offer interested readers our Digital Budget Book, a user-friendly transparency tool that covers all aspects of the Town's annual and historical budgets.

COMMUNITY SAFETY AND WELFARE

The safety and welfare of our residents is a primary focus for the Town, and we offered the following as a way to focus on the importance of being prepared and safe.

Fire Safe Community Award Recognition and Training

There are 500 fire departments across South Carolina, and the Edisto Beach Fire Department was one of only 154 fire departments to receive the "Fire Safe South Carolina" designation. Fire Safe South Carolina is a community risk reduction program and provides this designation to fire departments that continually work to reduce fires and related injuries in South Carolina, which results in decreased risks for residents and firefighters. To receive the designation, fire departments must complete courses to improve data quality, must train community partners to deliver in-home safety visits, and must further develop their skills through online National Fire Academy courses in risk reduction and assessment.

Hurricane Tabletop Exercises with Colleton County Emergency Management Department

In an effort to ensure the Town is ready for the hurricane season, tabletop exercises are held annually with Colleton County Emergency Management Department. During the exercise held on May 29, 2024, various emergency scenarios, information, and needs assessment are all covered in this exercise. Following this exercise, Town officials then hold an informational session on hurricane preparedness with residents.




Hurricane Preparedness Workshop

On June 7, 2024, Town officials held the 3rd Annual Hurricane Preparedness Workshop for residents. This workshop provides important information to residents, such as preparing homes for hurricane season, evacuation routes, emergency requests, etc.

AirMedCare Network Municipal Site Membership Agreement for Town Residents

For the past few years, Town Council has approved membership agreements with AirMedCare. This agreement provides free helicopter transport for medical



necessities by an AirMedCare provider for all individuals who reside within the boundaries of the Town and for transport from a pickup location in Colleton or Charleston counties.

Camera Registration Program

The Town and the Police Department partner with residents and businesses to create a safe community through the use of surveillance cameras. Early access to surveillance footage can reduce investigation time and increase the likelihood of recovering property. This program provides reliable information on the location of cameras throughout the Town to aid in investigations and public safety issues. Many residents, homeowners, and businesses have joined us in this program.



Beach Wheelchair Program

The Edisto Beach Fire Department provides beach wheelchairs on loan free-of-charge. The majority of the beach wheelchairs have been funded with ATAX funds and donations. During Summer 2023, beach wheelchairs were checked out approximately 200 times.


