Fire Extinguisher Program

As part of the Fire Safe South Carolina Community Risk Reduction Program, Fire Chief Denney Conley, Assistant Fire Chief Ken Sallenger and the volunteer firefighters have focused on fire extinguisher education for the Town of Edisto Beach.

The fire extinguisher education program is conducted in a monitored setting. Proper use of the extinguisher is explained, and then hands-on training is provided for the participants. Earlier this the Fire Department vear, also program presented this to older children, teenagers, and counselors at Baptist Church. An Beach Edisto important component of this program is to involve children as soon as possible so they can learn what to do in the event of a fire. Those who participated at Edisto Beach Baptist Church were engaged and very interested in learning this important information. - June 12, 5:55 pm: Public Hearing on the Second Reading of budget ordinance to adopt the 2025-2026 budget
- June 12, 6:00 pm: Second Reading on budget ordinance at monthly Town Council meeting

All meetings are open to the public.

Tourist Season Begins

This month will bring many spring break and other visitors to our beach, so we remind all to be safe on the road, on the beach, and on the water.

As well, we ask our visitors to be mindful of the following which are **prohibited** on our beach:

- Glass containers
- Bonfires
- Littering
- Motorized vehicles
- Motorized water craft
- Sailboats on sand dunes or grassy areas of dunes
- Parking on sand dunes
- Unleashed dogs prohibited on the beach May 1 through Oct 31
- Leaving holes on beach
- Disturbing or hanging items on sand fencing
- Disturbing, damaging, trampling or removing vegetation that stabilizes dunes

PLEASE NOTE: There are no lifeguards on duty. Practice personal water safety and leave only your footprints in the sand. Please respect our citizens and do not trespass on private property.

Sea Turtle Season/Lights Out May 1 - October 31

The sea turtle nesting season is May 1 to October 31, and we remind all of the following items in Town Ordinance regarding artificial light, which must be minimized to protect disorienting nesting and hatchling sea turtles:

- window treatments must be used in ocean-facing windows to prevent interior lighting from shining onto the beach; blackout drapes and shade screens are preferred, and the addition of tinted window film or awnings is encouraged.
- exterior decorative, security, or recreational lighting shall be shielded or screened from 10 p.m. until dawn.
- lights illuminating dune crosswalks of any areas oceanward of the dune line shall be turned off from dusk to dawn.
- motion-activated security lights are permitted but must use low-profile luminaries and be screened in a way that they do not illuminate the beach.

We appreciate your cooperation in ensuring Edisto Beach remains a safe nesting ground for our sea turtles.

- Approval of Agreement for Professional Services with Davis & Floyd for Yacht Club Drainage Study in the amount of \$18,300.
- Approval of Estimated Fee Proposal from ECS Southeast, LLC for construction materials testing and special inspection services for the new EOC/Town Hall project in the amount of \$94,895.
- Approval of the following special event applications: Edisto Island Open Land Trust Donor Appreciation at Bay Creek Park on April 5 from 2-5 p.m.

At a Special Town Council Meeting held on March 19 at 10:00 a.m., Town Council approved SCIIP Grant #A-23-C065 Wastewater System Upgrades Approval of Change Order #1 for J.S. Haren Company for the replacement of pumps at Bay Point, Summerwind, Docksite, Scott Creek, Cheehaw, Lee, Club Cottage C, and Oristo in the amount of \$503,208.
