SCIIP GRANT INFO

- SC General Assembly approved federal funding from the American Rescue Plan Act.
- SC RIA awarded \$1.3 billion in grant funding for communities across the state to assist with improvements for clean drinking water, sanitary sewer, stormwater and resilience.
- 216 grants awarded to local governments.

Pump Stations A & B Completed

As part of our Wastewater Improvement Project, both Pump Stations A and B have been updated and constructed, and final testing on Pump Station A is being conducted. Both pump stations were installed with larger pumps, along with new variable frequency drives, and controls at both pump stations.

In 2023, the Town received \$8,904,385 in funds through the South Carolina Infrastructure Investment Program (SCIIP) and \$500,000 from the Rural Infrastructure Authority (RIA) to be used toward wastewater system upgrades within the Town.

In March 2021, Town Council imposed a moratorium on connecting to the Town's sewer system due to the over-extension of the distribution system. Capacity issues at the collection facilities and much-needed updates are now being addressed. At the September 12 Town Council meeting, Council approved the first reading of the termination of the sewer moratorium. The second reading is expected to be considered on October 10. Once the termination of the moratorium is approved, work will begin on accommodating the existing and allocated capacity.

As a reminder, these improvements will not expand the Town's sewer system. Instead, these improvements will improve the existing infrastructure.

Bay Creek Park Dock Repairs

Repairs to the Bay Creek Park Dock are currently underway by Clean Marine. Work on the dock will include substructure and superstructure improvements, new railings and decking. This work is expected to last approximately five months.

While Bay Creek Park remains open for other activities, the Town requests all avoid entering the dock/fishing pier area during this construction time.




Tropical Storm Helene Update

The Town is continuing to clean-up debris from Tropical Storm Helene. The bulk of the sand on Palmetto Boulevard has been removed by DOT, and they will also come back to sweep the remaining sand.

It appears that no structural damage was experienced on our residential homes and buildings. A couple trees fell during the storm, and a power outage occurred for all of Edisto Beach.

We have all heard the heartbreaking accounts of those in the Upstate and in other states experiencing the worst of Helene. Please let this be a reminder to all to (1) have an emergency plan in place with your family; (2) ensure your home is safeguarded as best as possible to deal with rain, wind, etc.; (3) check your home insurance policy to ensure all needed coverage is up-todate.

Sand Fencing Notice

The Town of Edisto Beach has applied to the South Carolina Department of Environmental Science (SCDES) Bureau of Coastal Management (BCM) for a General Permit to repair and replace sand fencing at the public beach along the Atlantic Ocean in Edisto Beach, Colleton County.

Comments will be received by the Bureau of Coastal Management at 1362 McMillan Avenue, Suite 400, Charleston, SC 29405, by fifteen (15) days from publication.

Sand fencing is used on beaches and dunes in South Carolina to help protect the coast from erosion and flooding, and to build new dunes. Sand fencing traps windblown sand to create new dunes or fill in gaps in existing dunes.

This is an annual, routine permit application.

September 2024 Town Council Meeting Highlights

At the regular monthly Town Council meeting held on September 12, 2024, the following are a few of the items approved by Council:

- Resolution 2024-R12 to declare September 2024 as South Carolina State Guard Month.
- Contract Change Order No. 1 for American Engineering for Pump Station A; labor and equipment to rebuild the bottom of the existing wet well in the amount of \$11,110.
- Approval of Bid Award in the amount of \$97,000 to Destination Dock for RFB #2024-03, Design-Build Services at Burley Lyons Park.
- Approval of Bid Award in the amount of \$76,510 to Blutide Marine Construction for construction services at Jungle Road Park as per RFB #2024-04.
- Appointment of two new members to the ATAX Board: Judith Blancett (Arts) and Marie Bost (At-Large).
- First Reading of Ordinance No. 2024-12 to terminate the temporary moratorium on the issuance and approval of new or additional connections to the Town's Town's sewer system as established by Ordinance No. 2021-13.
